I hope everyone is having a great semester so far!








## What are some things you enjoy doing in your free time?

Dr. Diaz is our undergraduate simulation coordinator and an associate professor here at UCF.




# Community Corner Olivia Kennell

We also hosted a bake sale on September 14th and sold various fall treats in the lobby of the College of Nursing to raise funds for SNA. We hope to see you at the next one!


